Notes The part call<sup>d</sup> vacant appear survey<sup>d</sup> the 30<sup>th</sup> of March 1793 - & August 12<sup>th</sup> 1794 - by virtue of a Warrant Granted To Henry Hubbell the 30<sup>th</sup> of March 1786 - and the part Call<sup>d</sup> Henry Hubbell appear survey<sup>d</sup> the 21<sup>st</sup> day of Novr. 1765 - In pursuance of a Warrant Granted To Samuel Brown the 24<sup>th</sup> day of June 1755 -

William Junken Esq<sup>t</sup> Claims part of the above Tract of Land survey<sup>d</sup> for Ferdinand Finata By Virtue of a Warrant for 100<sup>ac</sup> in the name of Jean Betty Dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1794 - bearing Interest from the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1774 - and altho there is still remaining more Land than sufficient to fill his Warrant agreeable to its Boundaries yet appears not satisfied - I am of opinion that it is no more than justice to Return the Survey of F. Finata as it was made by Lyon Wm Harris D.S.
