



A Draught of A tract of Land situate on Everts Creek and on the North West side of Ragged Mountain in Cumberland Valley Township Bedford County containing nine hundred and fifty seven Acres and allowance of Six per Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed for James Dow the 10th day of June 1766 on Warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763. — No 1 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for John Blair on Warrant dated the 29th day of July 1823. This tract interferes one Hundred and fifty three acres with the James Dow survey - John Blair is the present owner. — No 2 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a a tract of Land surveyed for William Perdev Jr. on Warrant dated the 19th day of May 1792 - this Tract Inter-ferees with the James Dow survey William Perdev Jr. conveyed to John Blair the present owner no survey returned on this warrant. No 3 represented dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for Thomas Smallman on Order No 3348 dated the 3rd day of April 1767. this tract interferes four acres and one Hundred and thirty eight perches with the James Dow survey - Thomas Smallman's heirs conveyed to Daniel Miller who conveyed to Henry Hartleroad who conveyed to John Crowden the present owner. — N.B. Michael Boor claims four hundred acres of the James Dow tract by virtue of 2 Warrants granted to Isabella Elder and George Elder dated the 21st day of June 1794 upon which no surveys have been made - Isabella Elder and George Elder conveyed to John Elder & James Elder who conveyed to Martin Boor who conveyed to Michael Boor the present owner - To Gabriel Heister Esq. James O Connor Esq.
