



A Draft of a tract of Land situate on a branch of Dunning's Creek called Scrub Grass in Greenfield township Bedford County containing six hundred and fifty five acres and Eighty perches, and allowance of six per Cent for roads &c- surveyed for John Goul on Warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763.

No 1 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for James Sterling on order No 1370 dated the 26th day of September 1766. This tract interferes Fifteen Acres with the John Goul survey- James Sterling conveyed to James Hunter who devised the same to James Hunter the present owner.-

No 2 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for Ephriam Williams on Warrant dated the 22nd day of August 1785- this tract Interferes one and ninety four acres with the John Goul tract Ephriam Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom it was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to Frederick Dupps the present owner.

No 3 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for William Kennedy on order No 1367 dated the 26th day of September 1766- This tract interferes three hundred and Eighteen acres with the John Goul survey William Kennedy conveyed to James Hunter who devised the same to James Hunter the present owner.

No 4 represented by the dotted and black lines is Claimed by virtue of a settlement made in the year 1796 by George Fox who conveyed to John Furthurs who conveyed to Thomas Furthurs who conveyed to John Ache who conveyed to James Green the present owner - no survey has been made on the above settlement
