



A Draft of A tract of Land situate on the waters of Dunning's Creek in St. Clair township Bedford County containing seven Hundred and Seventy three acres and one Hundred and thirty three perches and allowance of six per cent for roads & so surveyed for John Shee on Warrant dated the 3rd day of June 1763. The dotted lines represent part of a Draft of a Tract of Land surveyed for Mary Taylor on Warrant dated the 23rd day of January 1786. This tract interferes one Hundred and Ninety three acres and Eighty seven perches with the John Shee tract. Mary Taylor conveyed to Mathew Taylor who conveyed part to William Morehead the present owner. the residue he conveyed to William Griffith who conveyed to Thomas Blackburn who conveyed to John Burkholder from whom it was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to George Livingston who conveyed to Joseph Tonnager who conveyed to Jacob Imler. Henry Imler and Abraham Imler the present owners. N.B. a part of the John Shee tract joining Mary Taylor on the West is claimed by virtue of a warrant granted to George Imler dated the 27th day of 1797 - for _____ Acres upon which no survey has been returned nor made. George Imler conveyed to Peter Imler the present owner. No 1 Bounded by the dotted and black lines is claimed by virtue of 2 settlements. one made by Jacob Mock thirty two years ago - Jacob Mock Devised the same to his widow the present owner the other made by John Berkheimer thirty five years ago. John Berkheimer conveyed to Samuel Radebush the present owner. no surveys have been made on the aforesaid Improvements To Gabriel Heister Esq^r S.G. James O'Connor D.S.
