



The Draught of a Tract of land situate in Ridley Township in the County of Chester containing one hundred and eighty six acres Resurveyed unto Edward Pritchett & Walter Faucit the 13th 14th & 15th days of the 8th month 1707 and subdivided between the said Walter & Edward into ten Lots or parcels six of fast land and four of Marsh
 Walter Faucit his first Lott of Marsh
 Begins at a maple tree in the Line of the Neals's land from thence Extending South 47 degrees East^{ly} by the said land 85 piches to a Post by Delaware River then up the said River north 85 degrees East^{ly} 35 per. to a post from thence North 35 Degrees westerly in the line of Edward Pritchets Marsh 95 perches to a Post thence South 62 Degrees west 50 per. to the place of Beginning containing

His second lott of Marsh Begins at a White oak by the side of Edward Pritchets field from thence South 25^d 30 min^{ts} east^{ly} by the said Pritchets marsh 71 perches to a willow tree by Crums creek Thence up the said Creek north 62 degr^s east^{ly} 24 per^s to a post thence north 25^d 30 min^{ts} west 74 perches by Edward Pritchets marsh to a black oak from thence from thence south 62^d west by the side of the fast land 24 perches to the place of the beginning containing

Walter Faucit's first lot of fast land Beginning at a hickory in the line of the Neals's land from thence south forty seven degrees east 26 perches to a post in the said line then north 63 degrees east in Edwd Pritchets line 56 per to a post then north 50 degt east 41 perche to a black oak by Crum-Creek then up therr up the said Creek on several Courses 62 perches to a dogwood tree by the said Creek from thence by Edward Pritchets land south 43 degrees west 70 perches to a small black oak thence south 62 degrees westerly 50 perches to the place of beginning containing

Walter Faucit's second lott fast land begins at a spanish oak in the line of the Neals land thence by the said line north 47 degrees west 36 per^s to a black oak thence North
