



Warrant to George Eby for 200 Acres of Land including his improvement adjoining the Lands of Hugh Wiley, Alexander McKeon, Joseph Whitmore & others in Letterkenny Township in the County of Franklin Dated the 29<sup>th</sup> January 1785.

Warrant to Christian Eby for 150 Acres of Land adjoining Sam<sup>l</sup> Nicholson, Hugh Wiley & Conegocheague Creek in Letterkenny Township in the County of Franklin Dated the 29<sup>th</sup> January 1785.

Warrant to James Cunningham for 300 Acres of Land on the Waters of Conegocheague bounded by Lands now or late of Albert Torrence James Torrence William Torrence William Anderson William Lindsay & others in Letterkenny Township in the County of Franklin Dated 4<sup>th</sup> February 1785.

Warrant to Samuel Nicholson for 300 Acres of Land on the Waters of Conegocheague bounded by Lands of George Eby on the West and Lands of Samuel Rhea on the East in Letterkenny Township in the County of Franklin Dated 26<sup>th</sup> March 1785.

The above Warrants are the only Office Rights belonging to the Parties which have come to my Hands or Knowledge, by which, when compared with the annexed Draft, it plainly appears they, or some of them interfere with each other, and that there is not Land enough to satisfy the Whole. George Eby in right of his Improvement and the two first Warrants, claims all that Part lying westward of the middle Lines. The Assignee of James Cunningham, so far as I can learn, in right of his Warr. claims the greater Part of the Land lying eastward of the 5<sup>th</sup> middle Lines, as also to have his Survey extended to the Western Branch of the Creek following said Branch down to a Place about where it approaches nearest the Line of Hugh Wiley, and from thence towards the Pine Corner & and so on. Samuel Nicholson in right of his Warrant claims a still greater Part of the Land lying eastward of those middle Lines, and adjoining the same. If I have mistaken, or not fully represented the particular Views or Claims of all the Parties, they will have Opportunity of setting them Forth in such Point of View as they may chuse before the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Board of Property on a Hearing, to whose Decision the whole of the Matters in Dispute will probably soon be referred.
