



The above Draught made by the black lines contain 12 acres & 14 perches of Land and the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Situated in Colerain township, Lancaster County, and is part of a larger Tract or Survey mad by Ge<sup>o</sup> Churchman D.S. the 30<sup>th</sup> of 12 m<sup>o</sup> 1754 in pursuance of 5 several Warrants granted to John M<sup>c</sup>Connel, two of them dated April 19<sup>th</sup> 1754 (and Indorsed on the back of said Survey as containing 240 acres) and in that Survey, each Warrant or Survey thereon, is designated by a Letter of the Alphabet, viz, A, B, C, D, E, and this Survey of 12 acres & 14 perches, is a part of the Warrant and Survey marked D, the dotted lines Represent the other parts of said larger Survey &c.
