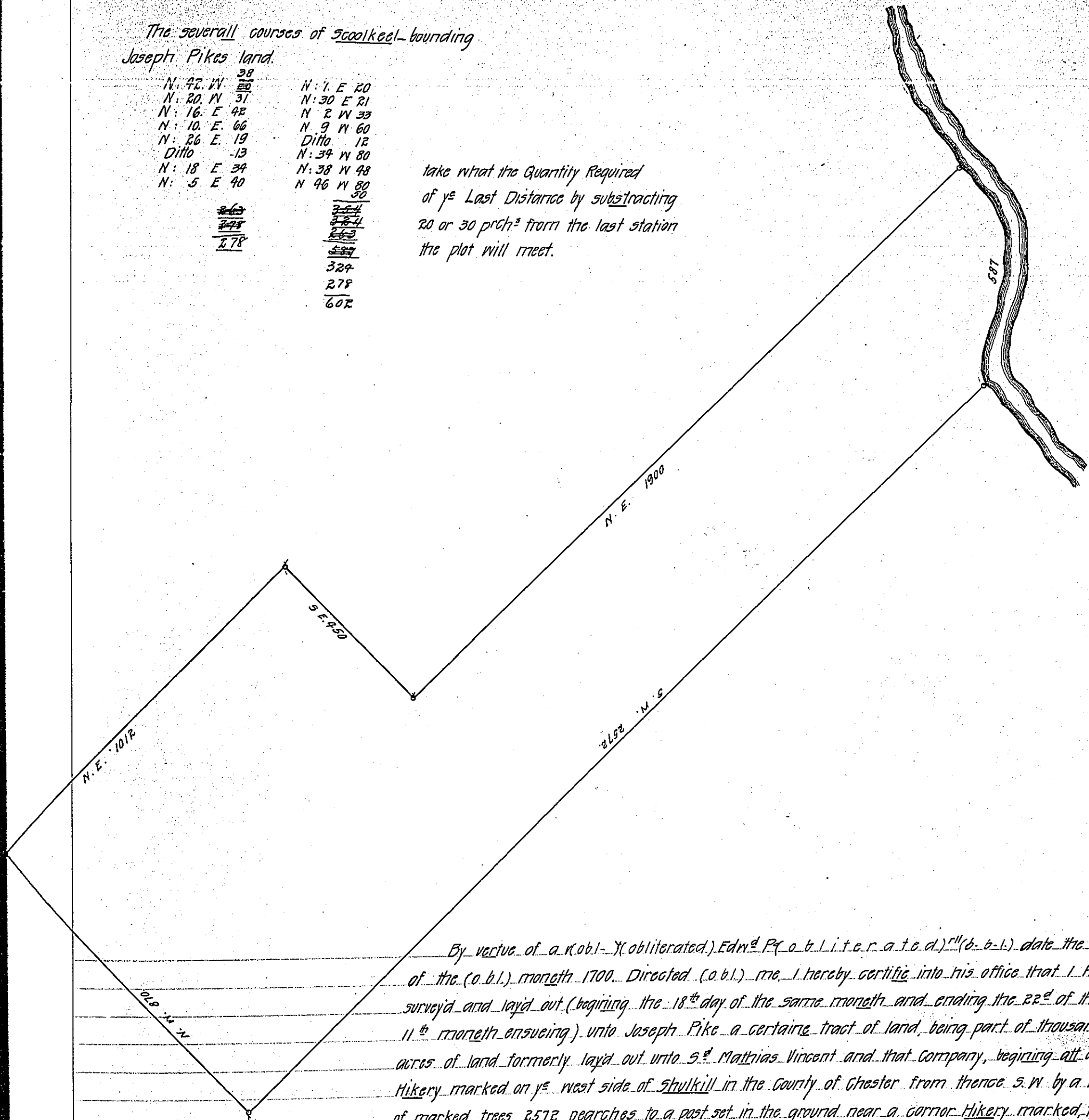

Directed (obl.) me I hereby certify into his office that I have surveyd and layd out (begining the 18th day of the same month and ending the 22^d of the 11th month ensuing) unto Joseph Pike a certaine tract of land, being part of thousand acres of land formerly layd out unto S^d Matthias Vincent and that Company, begining at a Hickery marked on y^e west side of Shulkill in the County of Chester from thence S.W. by a line of marked trees 2572 perches to a post set in the ground near a cormor Hickery marked from thence N.W. by a line of marked trees eight hundred and seventy perches to a stake set in the ground hard by a black oake, marked from thence N.E. by a line of marked trees one thousand and 1012 perches to another stake set in the ground, between a black and white oake, marked from thence S.E. four hundred and 50 perches to a post ~~marked~~ ^{set in the ground} from thence N.E. by a line of marked trees one thousand and nine hundred perches to a post by the said Scoolkeel from thence by the severall Courses of the said River five hundred and eighty two perches to the place of begining Layd out for ten thousand acres of land, w^t an hundred and sixteen acres in l^{ue} of Roades Containeing in the whole within the bounds above said ten thousand and an hundred and sixteen acres of land I say surveyd as above said by me.
