Yo<sup>r</sup> pet<sup>r</sup> humbly prayes that ye will grant him the sd 45 foot to make a wharff there, & build thereon for that he will begin forthw<sup>th</sup> thereon, and that he may have a patent for the same at a reasonable Rent.

Contyning in Breadth 45 foot and in Length 250 foot Bounded No<sup>r</sup>ward with a 30 foot Street eastward w<sup>th</sup> ye River Delaware at ye said extent of 250 foot southward with vacant ground and to ye westward with Delaware front Street
