



By virtue of four warrants from the Commission^{rs} of Property bearing date (all of them) the 5th day of the first month 1715/6 to lay out unto the four men mentioned in the above protracted figure each of them a tract of land in the great swamp in the County of Bucks, surveyed & laid out unto the sd men each of them a particular tract in the sd place as followeth; The first to Robert Gerard Beginning at three linden trees growing upon one root, standing on the south side of a creek called the north branch of Perkeormen, from thence extending N. N. E. four hundred perches to a post, Then E. S. E. one hundred perches to a small Hickory, Then by Michael Atkinson S. S. W. 400 perches to a heap of stones, Then W. N. W. one hundred perches to the beginning. The second to Michael Atkinson Begins at the last mentioned heap of stones, Thence by the sd Robert Gerard N. N. E. 400 perches to a small Hickory, Then E. S. E. 100 perches to a post, Then by John Moore S. S. W. 400 perches to a white oak, Then W. N. W. 100 perches to the beginning; The third to John Moore, begins at the last mentioned white oak, Thence by the sd Michael Atkinson N. N. E. 400 perches to a post, Then E. S. E. 100 perches to a post, Then by Thomas Roberts S. S. W. 400 perches to a post, Then W. N. W. 100 perches to the beginning; The fourth to Thomas Roberts Begins at the last mentioned post, Then by the sd John Moore N. N. E. 400 perches to a post, Then E. S. E. 100 perches to a white oak, Then S. S. W. by vacant 400 perches to a white oak, Then W. N. W. one hundred perches to the place of Beginning, containing each of them particularly, 250 acres. Laid out the 28th 1st mo. 1716
