



The Draught of Coll. John French's land Situate on Susquehanna River and Pequea Creek in the County of Chester.  
 Beginning at a corner marked white oak standing on the west side of the 5<sup>th</sup> Pequea Creek Thence ~~South~~ (obliterated) by vacant land two hundred and eighty perches to a white oak Thence west by south by vacant land Three hundred & fifty perches to a corner marked Spanish Oak standing by Susquehanna River then up y<sup>e</sup> same one hundred perches to a Spanish Oak Thence east north east by vacant land four hundred & fifty perches to a black oak Thence east south east by vacant land Two hundred and ninety perches to a white oak Thence south by vacant land sixteen perches to a Hickery by the 5<sup>th</sup> Pequea Creek the (obliterated) Down the same sixty perches to the Place of Beginning Containing five hundred acres w<sup>th</sup> the allowance of six P<sup>e</sup> Gerit Surveyd the 24<sup>th</sup> of May 1718.
