



By virtue of a warrant from Edward Penington Surveyor General bearing date the 30th of ye 10th mo. 1700, directed unto me I hereby certify unto his office that I have surveyed and laid out the 4th day of ye 11th mo. Ensueing unto Daniell Falkner, Johannes Kelprus and Johannes Jarvert Agents for the German Society a certaine tract of land within the Liberty of Philadelphia Beginning at a blak ok by the Mill Creek from thence east north east 16.7 perches by a line of marked trees deviding it from the land of Edward Penington and Company to a stake being a corner of George Peere and William Watsons land from thence north by a line of marked trees part by the said Peere and Watsons land and also other lands adjacent 137 perches to a line of John Thomas land from thence by the land line of marked trees west 14 perches thence west 6 degrees south 24 perches to a branch running into the said Mill Creek from thence by the severall courses of the said branch and Creek 235 perches to the plac-of begining Containeing and laid out for one hundred and twenty acres and fifty one perches.
