



By virtue of a warrant from ^{Depty} the Govern^r bearing date 1st of 4th mo. 1682.
 Layed out for Georg-Andrews a tract of land called Spi-Parke situated & being on the west side of Delaware River & on the west side of on of the maine branches of Narrmans Creek.
 Beginning at a corner marked ash tree standing by the side of Narrmans creek, & from thence N b W by a line of marked trees 166 perches to a corner marked white oak from thence N b E by a line of marked trees 116 perches to a corner marked road oak then N b W by a line of marked trees 112 perches ^{to a road oak} and from thence E b N by a line of marked trees 225 perches to a corner marked white oak standing by the side of on of the maine branches of Narrmans Creek from thence downe by 5^d branch on severall courses 440 perches to the first mentioned ash tree containing 250 acres of land.
 Surveyed the 23^d of 4th mo. 1682.
