And in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to Unpatented Lands under Proprietary rights &c. &c.

Notes & References to the above Diagram.

The above black lined figure A, B. & C. represents the Tract above returned on the warrant to John McTenny & is covered by the following Office Rights, viz: The part marked A surveyed 23d April, 1793, on Warrant to Andw Dunlop & Edw'd Crawford dated 5 of March, 1793. not pat'd. The part marked C in red lines is covered by a warrant dated 17 January, 1785, granted to Humphrey Fullerton & perhaps a patent issued. Pat'd. The part marked B covered by a warrant to Hugh Brotherton dated 16th of August, 1792. not pat'd. Order of survey to Alexander McGrew dated 15 June, 1767, No. 3869 for 150 a on the East South Side of Conococheague Creek joining John Herr & Wm. Brotherton in Guilford Township, appears to embrace fairly that part of the above Tract lying on the South side of the Creek. The above tract is owned in part by Messrs Ridgely & McDonald occupied by Augustus Shryock. The part B. owned & occupied by Hugh Brotherton and part by Jacob Heyser.
