The red lines of the large tract represented above is the original survey of George Webb's Wat. dated the 4. March, 1750, which appears to have been made in the year, 1752 Actual Survey but on the 6th of April 1774, an other survey was made for it according to the yellow lines Present Owners above and so returned, and on the 13 June 1755 James Scull's survey (the blue survey the heirs of Jacob Myer did above) was already made, also on the 4th of November, 1790, a warrant was granted and the heirs of George Ege above) to Lewis Hering, which was surveyed & returned according to the green lines above Esqr. de'd who hold and occupy the same laid down.
