



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate on the Branches of Tulpehocken Creek in Chester County, Survey'd for Guiljelma Maria Fell (Wife of Charles Fell of London Gent.) the second day of November Anno Dom. 1727. Beginning at a corner marked black oak standing on the top of a hill on the south side of the Main Branch of the sd Tulpehocken Creek and on the east side of a Run called Hans Moore's Run thence north 30° easterly crossing the sd branch 872 pches to a white oak thence W. by N. 130 pches to a black oak thence north 32° West crossing a Run called Martin Sharva's Run 200 pches to a post by a marked white oak thence South 80° westerly 2140 pches to a hickery thence south west 286 pches a small black oak thence south crossing the old Main Branch 370 pches to a white oak thence E. by S. 256 pches to a hickery thence east 470 pches to a white oak thence North 65° easterly 320 pches to a hickery thence E. by N. 214 pches to a white oak thence north 70° easterly 240 pches to a small white oak thence E. by S. 480 pches to a white oak thence south 55° easterly 235 pches to the place of Beginning Containing ten thousand acres
