



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Upper Dublin Township in the County of Philada about 16 miles from the City. Surveyed the 24th day of November, 1693, by Warrant of the 2nd day of the same Month unto Mathias Souly late Purchasor, who left the Province long ago and has not been heard of within the memory of the oldest settlers now living in the neighbourhood. And for many years some Irish and other idle people have occupied it and made great wast of the Timber which was but indifferent. And quite impoverished the land, which is generally a very thin soil and stony. Their buildings are but so many small Log Hutt^s and their fencing very bad. They ^{have} been of late indulged in their possessions by John Petty who pretends to have purchased of some person in England a Tract of land in the same Township, which he cant find agreeable to his deed, as tis said, and therefore as Souly is not to be heard of he thinks to keep this in lieu of that he purchased which was but 250 acres. This was surveyed for 300⁹ but upon a late examination of the lines upon the application of Jonathan Paul to purchase it of the Proprietaries, it is found to contain 318 acres & an allowance of 6⁰⁰ P. Cent. About 60a of it is Meadow and Swamp as much Wood Land not cleared and nearly the same quantity is exceeding barren Pine & Ground Oat Land and about 140 acres of it is cleared Land.
