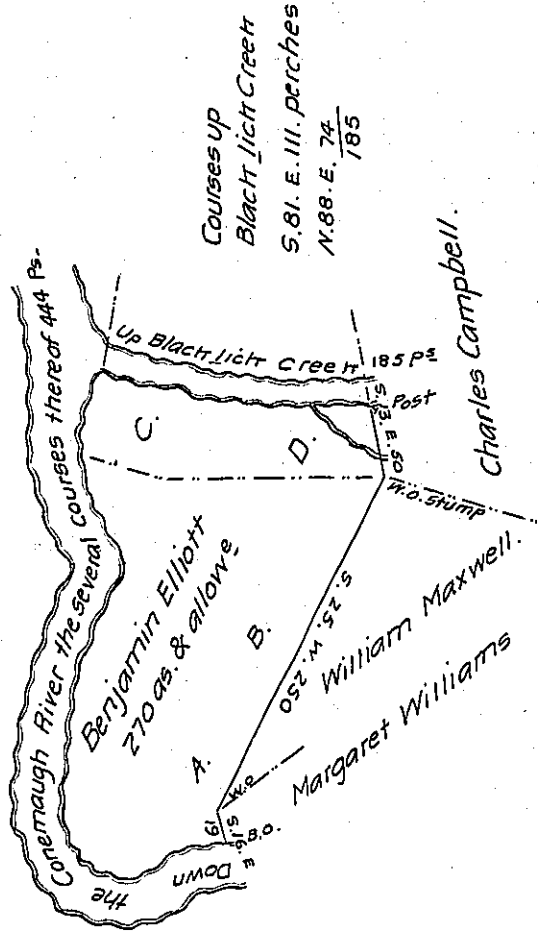


Several courses and distances down the Conemaugh River

Surveyed to Benjamin Elliott on the 24th day of January, 1828 the above described tract of two hundred and seventy acres and allowance of six per cent adjoining Margaret Williams, Wm. Maxwell and Charles Campbell situate in the forks of the Conemaugh and Black Lick Creeks in Black Lick Township in the County of Indiana, By virtue of an location of the 3d April 1769, No. 645, done and executed in pursuance of the authority of the Board of Property and of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and for other purposes

N.B. That part of the above survey represented by the dotted line and the letters A & B. was surveyed to William Maxwell the 25 Jan'y, 1790 by Warr of the 12 June 1785. And that part including the letters C & D. was surveyed to Charles Campbell on the 23d January 1790 by Warr of the 3d April, 1786.
