

The Land sold to Isaac Norris by Samuel Carpenter lying partly in the Liberties of Philadelphia and partly in Shikamaxon Begins at a stake by the Stump of an oak (falm) near Gunners Creek at a corner of Thomas Fairmer's land Thence north ^{west} by the said Fairmer's land fifty three perches and a half to a post Thence south west thirty perches to a post Thence north west thirty two perches to a post Thence north east thirty perches to a post Thence north west one hundred and thirty perches to a post Thence north seventy degrees westerly one hundred fifty seven perches to corner white oak all the Lines hitherto mentioned running by the said Thomas Fairmer's land Thence north north west by John Goodson's land eighty perches to a corner post Then east north east by another parcel of the said Norris's land (by him purchased of Arnold Castile) ninety four perches to a post Thence by the same land north north west one hundred and thirteen perches to a post Thence east north east by John Farris's land one hundred and thirteen perches to a post Then south south east by Joseph Growdon's land two hundred and forty two perches to a post Thence east north east by the same land eighty eight perches to a post Thence south south east by Francis Ravis's land one hundred sixty two perches to an hickery tree by the said Gunners Creek Then down by the same ^{to} the Begin^g. Containing four hundred fifty eight acres.
