In the Common Pleas at Philad^a June court 1721.
Ordered by the Court that a New Venire Issue to the Coroner of this County in this cause. And that the Coroner take with him Jacob Taylor Surveyor General in the presence of the Pitt & Deft, if they will be present with four other discreet & Indifferent men of this County. And run out the land in question, And make return thereof to the next court. And that the defts if they will may Call to there Assistance any other Surveyor to be then present.

Pursuant to an Order of Court hereunto Annexed, I the Coroner of the City and County of Philadelphia with Jacob Taylor Surveyor General and four indifferent men of ye^e sd^e County Vizt John Budd, Israel Pemberton, Thomas Tresse and Samuel Robins have run out the land in Question as by the sd^e Order is Directed. And do find the Triangle within (obl) black lines (obliterated) six acres a little more or less; and the Triangle extending (about Twelve perches) to the Red line to contain fifty six acres a little more or less, as by the above Plat appears. And that every side of ye^e Greater and lesser Triangle are old markt lines; but that the black line parallel to the Red line appears to be much the older. Witness our hands the second day of September 1721.
