



Pennsylvania S.S.

In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 14th day of November 1741 directed to me for Surveying for the Use and Behoof of the Honourable the Proprietaries the Tenth Part of all such Lands as shall be Surveyed within the said Province I caused to be Surveyed on the 26th Day of October 1742 a Tract of Land Situate on the Branch of — on the West side of Susquahanna River in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a marked Spanish oak near the Mountain and from thence extending by Robert M^cConoghy's Land East Three hundred and forty six perches to a marked Spanish Oak, Thence by Abraham Wilson's Settlement North One hundred and twenty perches to a marked Spanish Oak, and East One hundred and ten perches to a marked White oak, Thence by the Lands of William Osborn and John Cox respectively, North Three hundred and Eighty Perches to a Post, thence by John Lawrence's Land West One hundred and Ninety six perches to a marked White oak, thence by William Symonds's Land South forty perches to a marked White oak, and West One hundred perches to a marked Chesnut. Thence along the Mountain South Seventy one Degrees West four hundred and Eighty six perches to the Place of Beginning, Containing Nine hundred and Eighty eight acres and the usual Allowance of Six Acres for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretarys Office the — Day of — Anno Domini 1746
