



To Nicholas Scull Surveyor General of the Province of Pennsylvania &c.

I Have in Compliance of thy Letter Dated the 29th Day of August last to me Directed thereby Authorizing me to run the lines of David Kennedys Land as the same was laid out to him by John Taylor, And as it was said there was a Strip of Land lying between the line of the Said Land laid out to Kennedy and Faggs Manner. (which it so) I was thereby Directed to Survey the same as also a piece of Land said to contain Sixty three acres lying Contiguous to the Said Kennedys other Land already Surveyed to him which I was to resurvey - I Have in Pursuance of the Said Direction run the lines of the said Kennedys Tract as the same appears to have been Surveyed by John Taylor and also I find a Strip of Land lying between the Said Manner line & the Land laid out to Said Kennedy which I have likewise Surveyed, And the Said piece of Land said to contain Sixty three acres I have resurveyed the same All which Said Surveys I return and make known the bounds and Quantities by the above annexed Draught. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand this 16th Day of September Anno Domini 1751.
