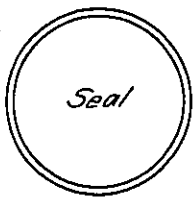


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Proprietaries

Whereas in pursuance of Our Warrant or Order there was Surveyed in the Year 1738 unto James Johnston late of Bucks County Yeoman, since deceased, a Certain Tract of one hundred and fifty acres and one quarter of an acre and allowance of six acres P Cent for Roads, situate in Tinecunn Township in the said County of Bucks [being part of a Tract formerly granted unto John Streiper situate on Delaware River and Tinecunn Creek and afterward Reconveyed to us] for which Tract so Surveyed to the said James Johnston he agreed to pay to our use at the rate of Thirty pounds Currency P hundred acres, and the Yearly Quit Rent of one half Penny Sterling P acre, And Whereas the Right to the said Surveyed Tract, under the said Contract, is now vested in Baltzer Keyler of the said County of Bucks Yeoman, who hath now humbly besought us to grant unto him our Warrant for the acceptance of the said Survey into your Office, And on Return thereof into our Secretary's Office our Patent of Confirmation for the same; Which, we favouring his Request, have condescended to do, on his paying to our use the residue of the said Purchase Monies with Interest and Quitrent from 1st of March 1739: These are therefore to authorize and require you to accept and receive the Survey so made as aforesaid into your Office and to make Return thereof into our Secretary's Office, in order for Confirmation to the said Baltzer Keyler as aforesaid And for your so doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant, Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Land Office, by vertue of certain powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelphia, this twenty fourth day of July Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty two.
