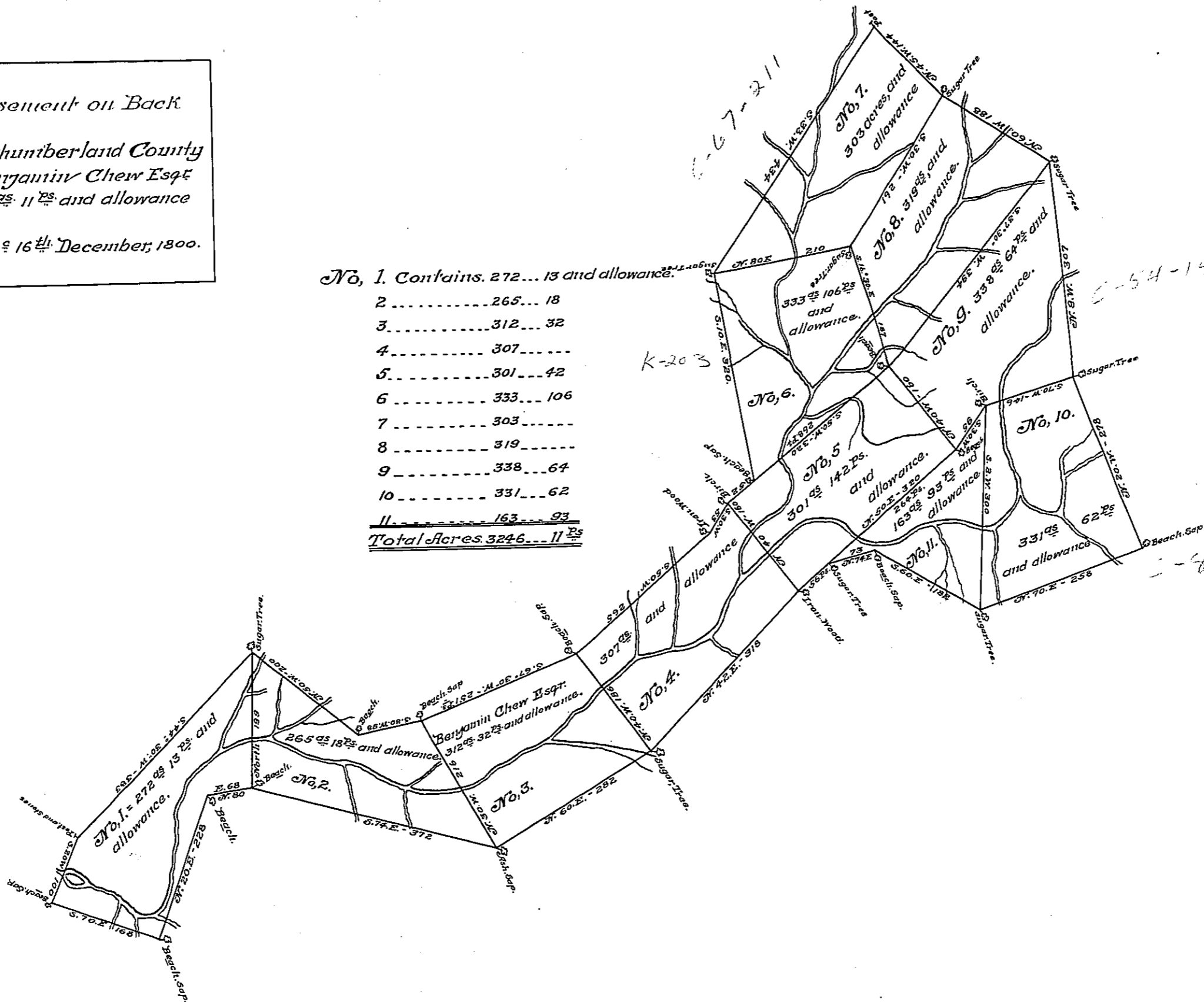

A draught of a tract of land called — situate on the waters of Weesaughpine Creek, nearly adjoining land granted to Joseph Shippen Esq in the County of Northumberland, including within the bounds of this survey the — Lots numbered 1. 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8. 9. 10. and 11. as represented in this plan, and containing in the whole, the quantity of Three thousand, two hundred and forty six acres, and Eleven perches besides the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads &c surveyed the first, second, and third days of November 1774 for Benjamin Chew Esquire, in pursuance of a warrant dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1774.
