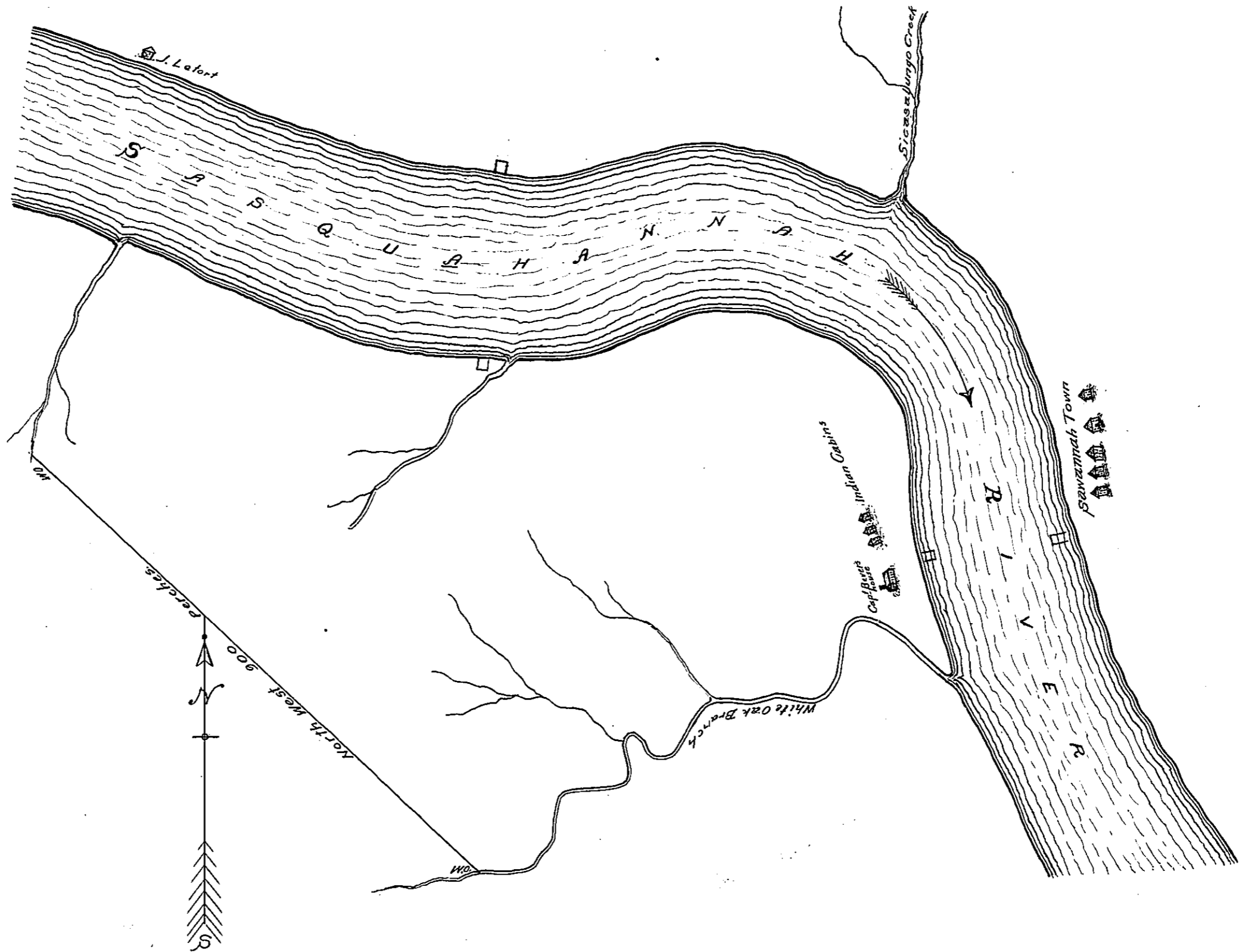

By Vertue, and in pursuance of a Warrant from Rich^d Hill, Isaac Norris & James Logar, Proprietary Agents for the Province of Pennsylvania, bearing date ye 5th of April 1722 (to us directed) We do hereby certify that We did actually survey & lay out on the 10th & 11th days of the same month for the uses mentioned in the said Warrant - a certain tract of Land situate on ye West side of Sasquahannah River. - Beginning at ye mouth of a branch opposite to the Savannah Town, and a little below the Settlement made by John Crist, now called White Oak branch & running up the same on the several courses thereof, One Thousand & fifty perches to a marked White Oak standing on a bank by a small Meadow near the said branch, from thence running by a line of marked trees North West Nine hundred perches to a corner marked White Oak standing in the waters near the head of a branch which runs into Sasquahannah opposite to the lower part of James Lefort's Plantation, Thence down the said branch by the courses thereof, Three hundred & twenty perches to the River side, Then down the same on ye courses thereof Fifteen hundred perches to the place of beginning
