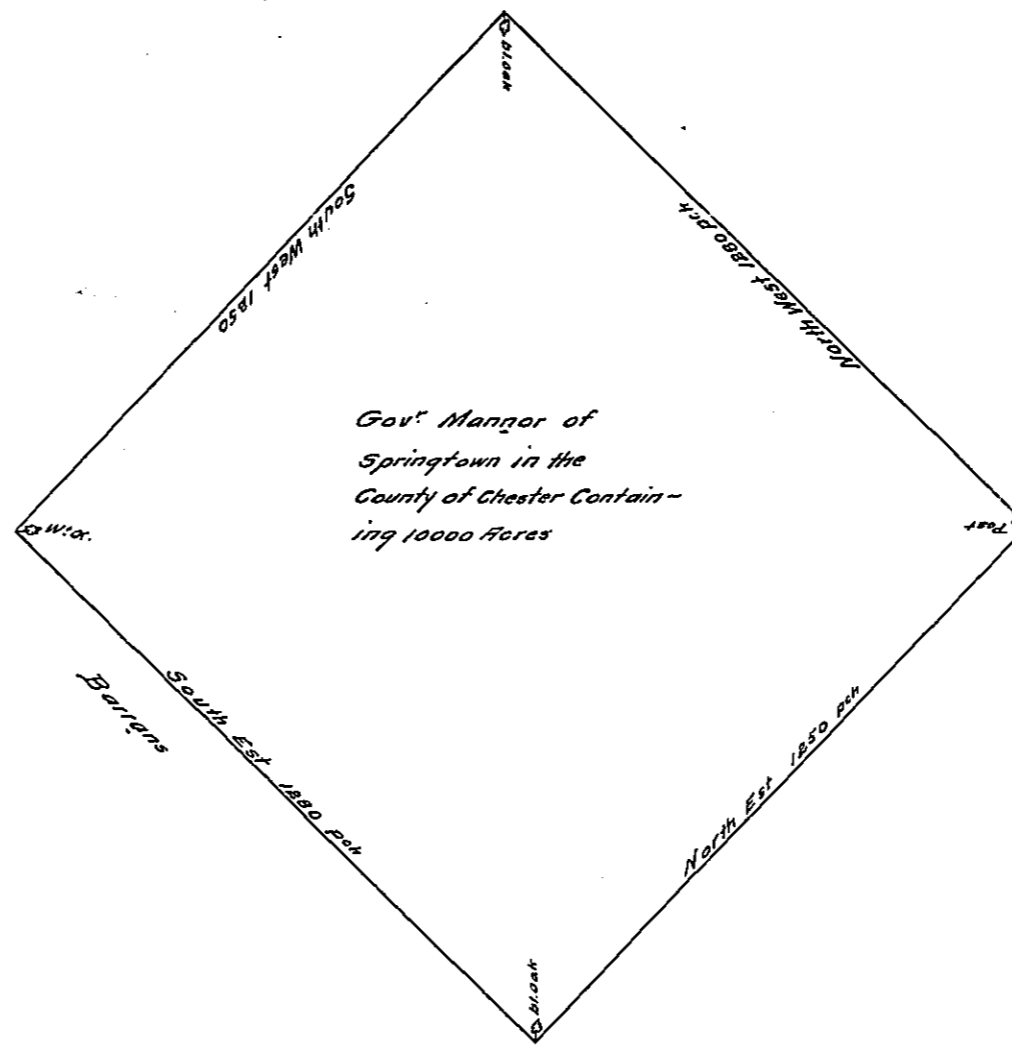

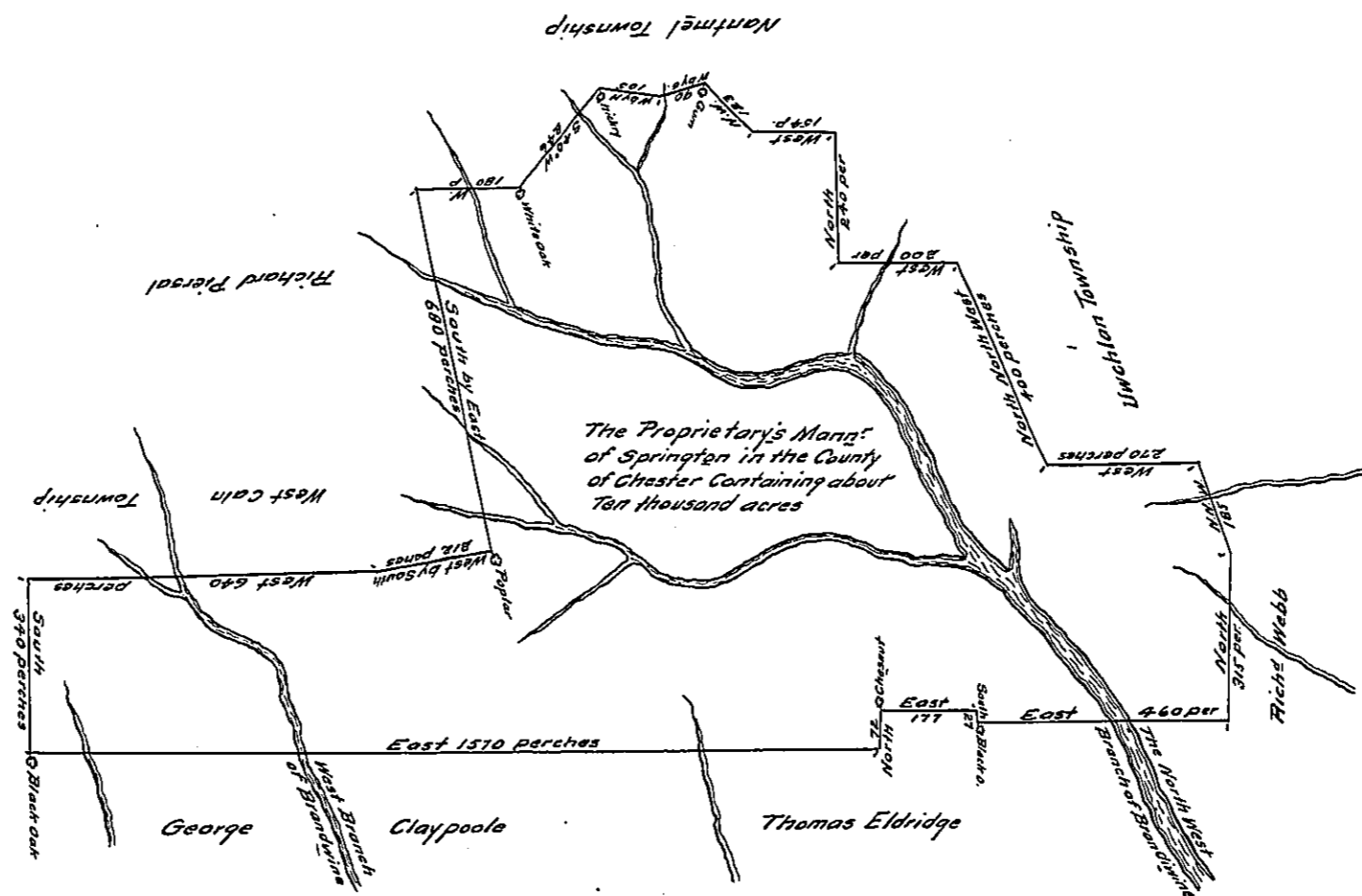

Penn A Manor celed Springtown in the County of Chester Beginning At a bounded black oak standing on the Est side of the barren Lying on the Est side of Brandywine Creek From thence by a Line of marked trees North Est 1250 pch to A post then by A line N.W. 1280 pch to A Corner marked black oak thence by A Line S.W. 1250 pch to A Corner marked White oak standing on the Edg. of the Aforesd barren then S.E. by ye 5th barren 1280 pch to the place of begining Containing 10000 Acres of Land the 13th 9th 1702
