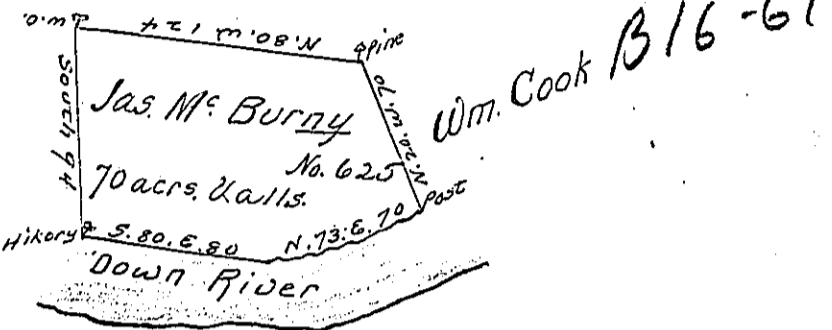

William Cook of Northumberland County Enters a caveat against the accepting of a Survey (or granting of a patent on the same) Made for James M^cBurny on a Warrant No. 625 on the upper End of a Bottom called Young Womans Town he the said Cook alledging that the same Enters with his preemptions Warrant on said Bottom said Survey Returned by William Montgomery Deputy Surveyor. Dated December 10th 1788. Wm. Cook
