

Pennsylvania ss.

In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 15th day of May 1746, there was surveyed to Philip Bousart a certain Tract of Land situate in Durham Township formerly in the County of Bucks, now in the County of Northampton. Beginning at a small marked Hickery in a Line of Philip Bousart's other Land, thence by the same West eighty five perches to a post & North Fifteen perches to a small marked Hickery, thence by Land of Nicholas Best South forty degrees West one hundred & two perches to a marked Black Oak, thence by Land of Adam Markel South fifty degrees East Seventy four perches to a marked Hickery Sapling, thence by Vacant Land North forty degrees East One hundred & forty six perches to the Place of Beginning, containing Fifty acres & 1/2 Land & fifty two perches with allowances of Six acres & 1/2 for 500: ads &c. Returned into the Secretarys office the 18th day of March 1757
