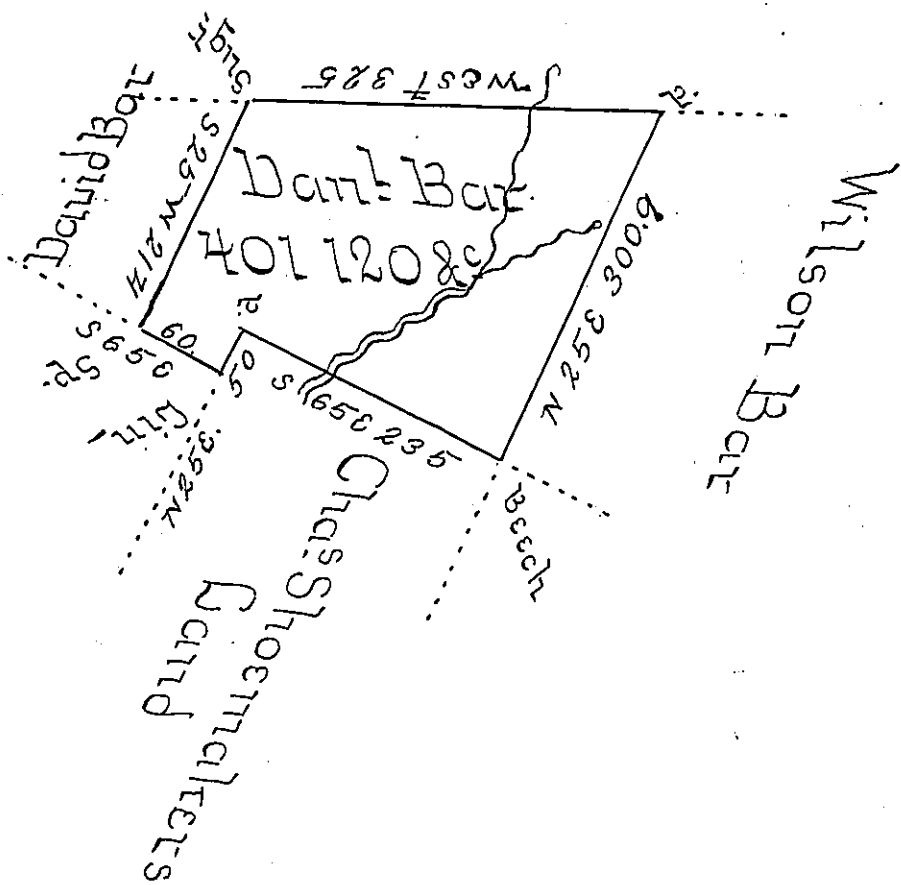

Situate on the waters of Black lick on the East side of Laurel hill, surveyed on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of May 1794 by George Woods U.S. on a warrant dated the 5<sup>th</sup> of Feb<sup>y</sup> 1794. then Bedford, now Cambria County, Susquehanna Township Resurveyed on the 25<sup>th</sup> of April 1836. The original lines found correct by & contains as per draft with allowance of 6pc. W<sup>m</sup> O'Keeffe D.S.
