



A Draught of a Tract of Land, situate in Upper Delford Township in the County of Philadelphia and Province of Pennsylvania Containing Four Acres of Land, together with the usual allowance at six per Cent for Roads, that was surveyed to John Berkey. By Virtue of a Warrant granted to him by the Honble Proprietaries Dated the 17th Day of June Anno 1772

Beginning at a Stone a Corner of Philip Fishers Land in the Line of the said John Berkeys other Land. Thence by the same South West, 42 perches and 3 Tenths of a Perch to above the middle of Berkjonne Creek. Thence upwards in the said Creek, and by Land of John Weidbide / Late John Mustadt / North 8^{deg} East 53 perches to the western Bank of the said Creek. Thence again Crossing the same, and by Land of the said Philip Fisher South East 32 Perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Four Acres, et allowance as aforesaid
