



In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioners of Property dated the 16th day of June 1772 a Survey was made on the 3^d day of July 1772 for Henry Settley on a certain lot of Ground Situate in the Town of Sunbury in Northumberland County marked in a General Plan of said Town Number Two Hundred and thirty one, containing in Breadth East & West on Blackberry Street Sixty feet, and in Length North and South Two Hundred and thirty feet, Bounded Northward by Blackberry Street, Eastward by Lot Number Two Hundred and Thirty, Southward by Gooseberry Alley, and Westward by Lot Number Two Hundred and Thirty Two. Returned into the Secretarys Office the 19th day of September 1776 for William Baker

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this first day of December 1903
