Whereas Thomas Benham in pursuance of his Order No. 276 did on the 22<sup>nd</sup> Oct: 1771. obtain a Survey said to contain 511<sup>as</sup> 21<sup>ps</sup> and Allowance and Whereas Balzer Myer & John Houser purchased the said Tract of Land and requested - that the same might be divided therefore the above described part of the said Tract of Land containing one hundred and seventy six Acres and 166 perches with an Allowance proportioned to six Per Cent situate in Franklin Township in the County of Westmoreland was on the 20<sup>th</sup> Aug: 1802 Surveyed to Balzer Myer -
