



Situated on the Waters of Redstone & Dunlaps Creeks in Manallin Township Fayette County, and Surveyed the 22<sup>d</sup> Day of March 1785 In Consequence of a Certificate Issued by the Commissioners for adjusting, and Settling the Claims to unpattented lands in the Counties of Monongahela Youghiogeni & Ohio

Of which the following is a true Copy

That the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the claims to unpattented land in the Counties of Monongalia, Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that Basil Brown assignee of William Colvin is entitled to four hundred Acres of land in the Counties of Monongalia & Yohogania on the waters of Dunlaps Creek to include his Settlement made in the Year of our Lord, one Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy.

Given under our hand, at Redstone old fort, the Sixteenth day of December 1779, in the fourth year of the Commonwealth.
