

The above is a Draught of a Tract of Land on the head waters of Worleys Run a Branch of Delongs Run, Being a Branch of Buffalo Creek, Called Comfort Containing Three Hundred and Fifty Two Acres Two Rod and five Perches, Surveyed April the 19<sup>th</sup> day 1785 at the request of Samuel Buchannan Ass<sup>ee</sup> of Joseph Worley on a Virginia Certificate Viz:

We the Commissioners for adjusting Claims to unpatented Lands, in the Counties of Yohogania Monongalia and Ohio do hereby certify that Joseph Worley is entitled to Four Hundred Acres of Land in the County of Ohio on the Waters of Buffalo to include his Settlement made in the Year 1773

Given under our hand at Coxes fort the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 1780 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth

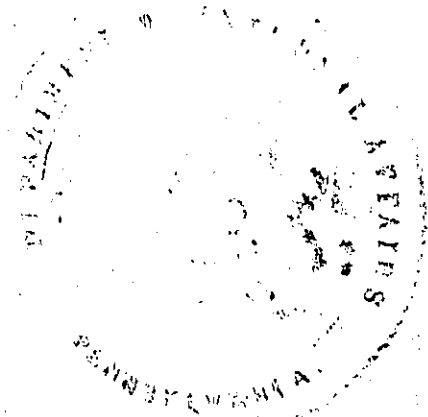
