



Draft of a tract of land situate in the long Swamp Township in the County of Berks in the State of Pennsylv<sup>a</sup> Containing Sixty One acres & One hundred & fifty six ps of land together with the usual allow<sup>ce</sup> at six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent for Roads - Now belonging to Jacob Long - Being part of a tract of 108 a<sup>s</sup> & 146 p<sup>s</sup> of land & allow<sup>e</sup>. That was formerly surveyed to Sam<sup>l</sup> Burger by Virtue of a Warrant from the Honb<sup>e</sup> Proprietaries of the 14<sup>th</sup> of Nov<sup>e</sup> Anno 1744 who afterwards sold his Right to the above Tract to the said Jacob Long & the remainder to Philip Basters - divided for them on the 24<sup>th</sup> Feby Anno 1769 - And now Resurveyed on the 3<sup>d</sup> of September Anno 1781 in pursuance of a Warr<sup>t</sup> of Resurvey & by Order of the Surveyor General dated on the 22<sup>d</sup> Aug<sup>t</sup> Anno 1781.
