We beg leave to inform you that there is about three Acres of Land Clear-  
ed at the place where the Letter B is placed on which there is a schoolhouse  
Erected, and being informed that it has been Occupied as such for thirty  
Years past by the Lutherian and Reformd Congragations in that neigh-  
borhood & that they Actually cleared & made the first Improvement on  
the same at the time of the Survey a number of the members of the said  
Congragations were present & appeared to be Considerable Alarmed re-  
specting the premises & informed us that part where the letter A is plac-  
ed has been always Kept as a Burying Ground on which there appears  
to be about Twenty Grakes and has been Inclosed, However upon the  
whole the Members of the Congragations have requested us to return  
the above Land in Dispute - as Michael Zigler claimes the whole In  
pursuance of his Warrant as above set forth.
