



Situate in Alleghany Township Huntington County first surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Baynton & Samuel Wharton dated the 28th day of July 1766 it then was said to contain 454 1/2 acres & the usual allowance. Now Resurveyed the 3rd day of Oct: 1822 (in pursuance of an Order of the Board of Property to me directed bearing date the 5th day of Sept: 1822) and is found to contain 454 3/4 acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c.

N.B. The dotted lines in the above diagram represent a survey made the 3rd day of Dec: 1764 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Samuel Smith dated the 3rd of Feb: 1755. The part marked B contains ten acres & 125 perches and shows how much Saml Smith is part of John Baynton & Saml Wharton.
