



Situate on the waters of Biggs run in Elk Lick Town-  
 ship Somerset County the part Christian Berkey of 111.<sup>a</sup>  
 112<sup>ps</sup> was Surveyed the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1804 and I think  
 has been returned to the Surveyor Generals Office.  
 In pursuance of his Warrant dated the first day of  
 february 1804 the part John Fire 124<sup>a</sup> and the part  
 Christian Burntrager of 25<sup>a</sup> Surveyed the same day on  
 their Warrants respectively dated the 24<sup>th</sup> day of May 1794  
 the whole of the above 3 surveys contains 296<sup>a</sup> 1/4<sup>a</sup> &  
 allow when all the fractional parts are rightly added  
 together and the land all belongs now to Christian  
 Cong<sup>r</sup> Statler as I am informed which he requests to be Granted  
 him in one Patent if agreeable to the rules of Office  
 Andrew Porter Esquire }  
 Surveyor General of Penn<sup>a</sup> } pr John McClean Deputy  
 Note the whole of the above land I believe  
 has been lawfully improved<sup>d</sup> when Surveyed there were two Settlements made  
 one on the South and the other on the north End of said land with a  
 continued residence ever since
