



Surveyed the 22d. day of December 1836 in pursuance of a warrant dated the 15th. of August 1836. Granted to Philip Barney Situate on the waters of the Dunk and fork of Wheeling Creek in Richhill township in the county of Greene including an actual Settlement and improvement. Containing 217 acres and 24 perches and the allowance of 6 per Cent. Called "Barney's Fancy"

To John Taylor Esquire Robert Bristor D.C. S. G. of Pa.

N.B. In lieu of James Patterson on the north now Hiram Gray and instead of Christian Barney on the South now John Parkinson
