- John Marsh's Land**: Located in the bottom right corner, bounded by "N. 49 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 36 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to the north and "S. 48 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 28 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to the south.
- David Cadwalader**: Located in the bottom right corner, bounded by "N. 49 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 36 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to the north and "S. 48 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 28 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to the south.
