



Survey to George Clymer on the 2^d of July 1799 the above described ^{tract} of four hundred and six acres and one hundred and thirty eight perches and allowed of six in Clerk. Situate on the Waters of Conemaugh, adjoining land of Robert Hinkston and others, including and Improvement in Wheatfield Township, ~~Pa~~ (now Indiana County) By Warrant of the 5th of August 1785

N.B. that part of the above tract as represented by the dotted lines and the letters A B & C, was surveyed to James Dill on the 16th of July 1784, by warrant of the 14th March 1788, that part as represented by the short dotted line and the letter D, is claimed by Archibald Jamison upon actual ^{Settlement} but no warrant has been issued the remaining parts of said Survey is vacant
