In pursuance of a warrant of 400^{ac} Granted to Alexander Caldwell now Deceased dated the 15th day of July A.D. 1816 was surveyed the 2^d day of January 1827 for Charles Caldwell son of the said Alexander Caldwell, the above described piece of land containing one hundred acres & allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c in pursuance of an agreement dated the 28th day of January A.D. 1818 Between the said Alexander Caldwell in his lifetime and the said Charles Caldwell it being the south east corner of the whole tract of which this is a part the Residue containing 301^{ac} 40^{ps} was surveyed for the use of the legal heirs & Representatives of the said Alexander Caldwell, Situate in Fairfield Township Crawford County Pennsylvania and that Asser Peterson is Residing on the same under the said Charles Caldwell and it appeared there was a house fit for the habitation of man and upwards of thirty acres cleared, fenced, & in a state of Cultivation including the original settlement of the said Alexander.
