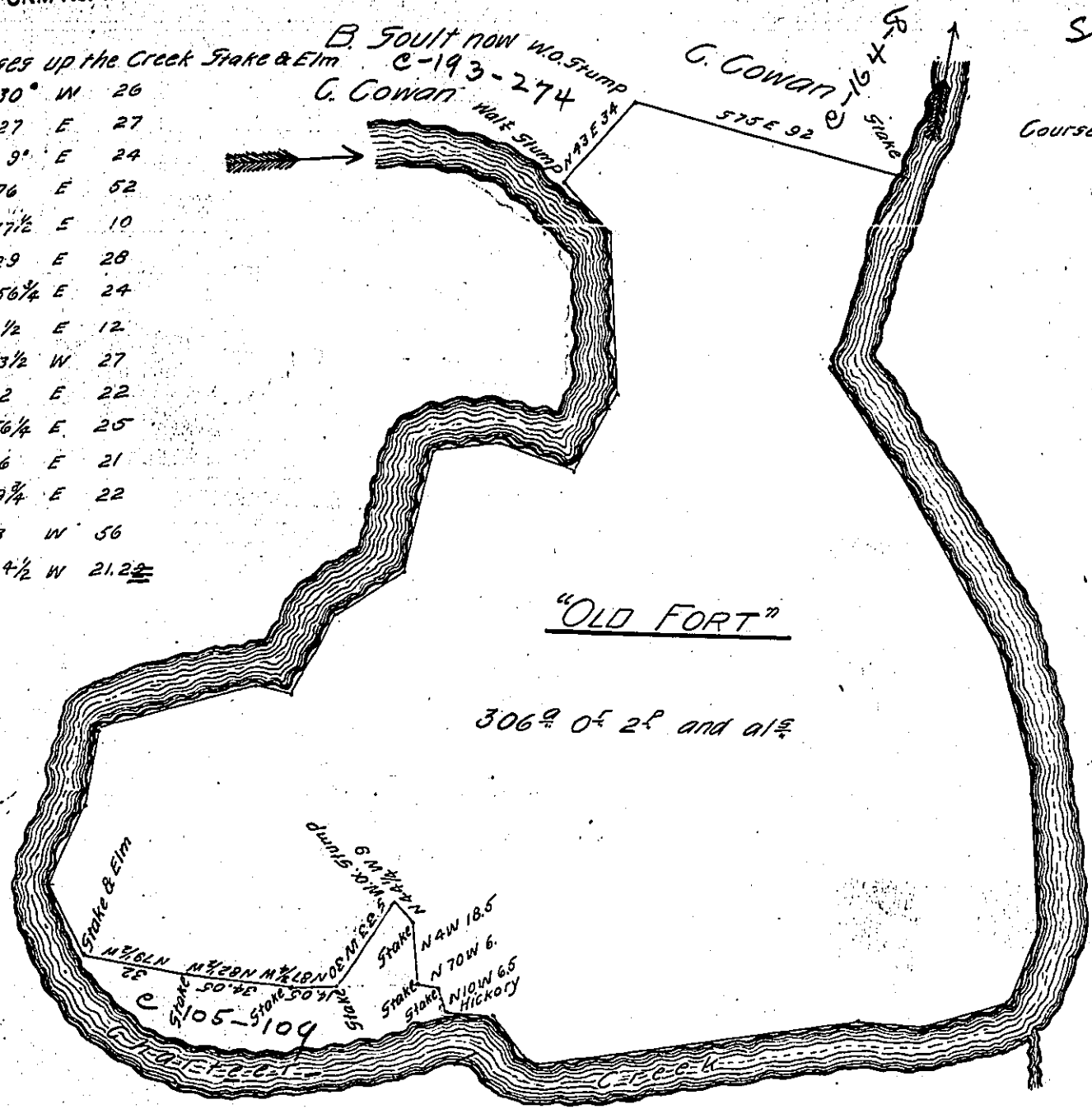

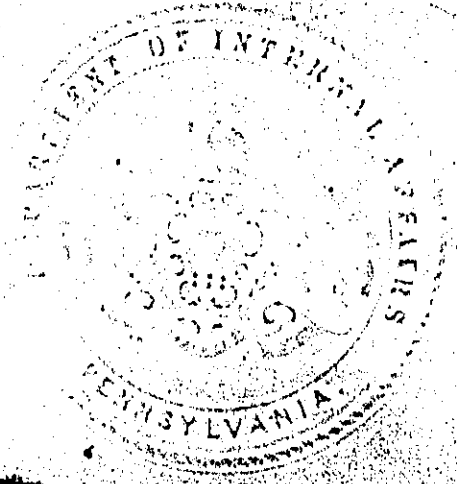
A Draught of a tract of land situate in Fayette Township Allegheny County on the Charleer creek called the "Old Fort" containing three hundred and six acres two perches and allowance of six p.ct. for roads. Surveyed February 14th 1828 for Christopher Cowan in pursuance of an order of the Board of Property to re-survey dated Nov 23rd 1827, originally surveyed ~~surveyed~~ by James Hendricks D.S. upon a location in the name of Henry Wright N^o 3114 dated 20th April 1769.

Note - at the time of making the above survey Mr. Cowan gave notice to the adjoining claimants and no part of the above survey was disputed or claimed by any person other than the said applicant.
