



The above described tract of Two hundred and Seventy nine acres and allowance of Six per cent adjoining lands of Robert Todd, Thomas Taylor, John Gibson and others situate in Blacklick township in the County of Indiana is part of two larger tracts - the one surveyed to Levi Gibson the 9th of March 1787 By Warrant of the 3^d of February 1786 - 140 acres of which is included in the above survey - the other surveyed to Charles Campbell the 1st of April 1828 by Warrant of the 24th of March 1828 139 acres of which is contained in the above survey - The Survey of Levi Gibson contained originally 416 1/2 acs & Allowance - And the Survey of Charles - Contained 188 acres & 128 perches & allowance. Divided off from said larger tracts this 1st day of April A.D. 1828 for Charles Campbell the present owner.
