Being part of a larger tract of 100<sup>ac</sup> & 69<sup>per</sup> allowance Originally Surveyed by Thomas Cookson late D.S. in pursuance of a Warrant for 100<sup>ac</sup> granted to John Francis Christian, dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January A. D. 1744. Resurveyed by John Forsyth late D.S. on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April 1797 - The above part resurveyed, and divided off, from the said larger tract, on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of March 1819 - and now at the request of George Henry, the present owner of said part, the Draught is examined, found correct and returned for confirmation - February 6<sup>th</sup> 1822 -
