



Situate on the North side of Raystown Branch of Juniatta — in Hopewell township Bedford County containing twenty acres 30 perches and allowance of six per cent &c. Surveyed the 2<sup>d</sup> October 1841 on warrant dated the 21<sup>st</sup> February 1804 granted to the said John Cummuskey for 20 acres.

To Jacob Sallade Esq. S.G. Michael Reed D.S.

N.B. On the 2<sup>d</sup> October 1841 when in the act of executing a warrant granted to Isaac Young dated the 30<sup>th</sup> November 1838 calling for the same land included in the above survey John Piper appeared upon the ground delivered <sup>into my hands</sup> a copy of the Cummuskey warrant with a copy of survey the same as the above in the handwriting of James Piper Esqr. made on the ground the 13<sup>th</sup> December 1838 ~~and~~ stated that by virtue of said warrant & survey he claimed the land and requested me to note the same on my returns &c. Refer to return on Youngs warrant sent herewith.
