Being part of a larger tract of land. Originally surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Crookham, Dated the 3^d day of January A.D. 1795 and said to contain 329^{ac} and allowance. Surveyed and divided from the residue of said tract the 15th day of March 1852, for Jacob G. Park. Reexamined and found correct the 5th day of March A.D. 1869.
