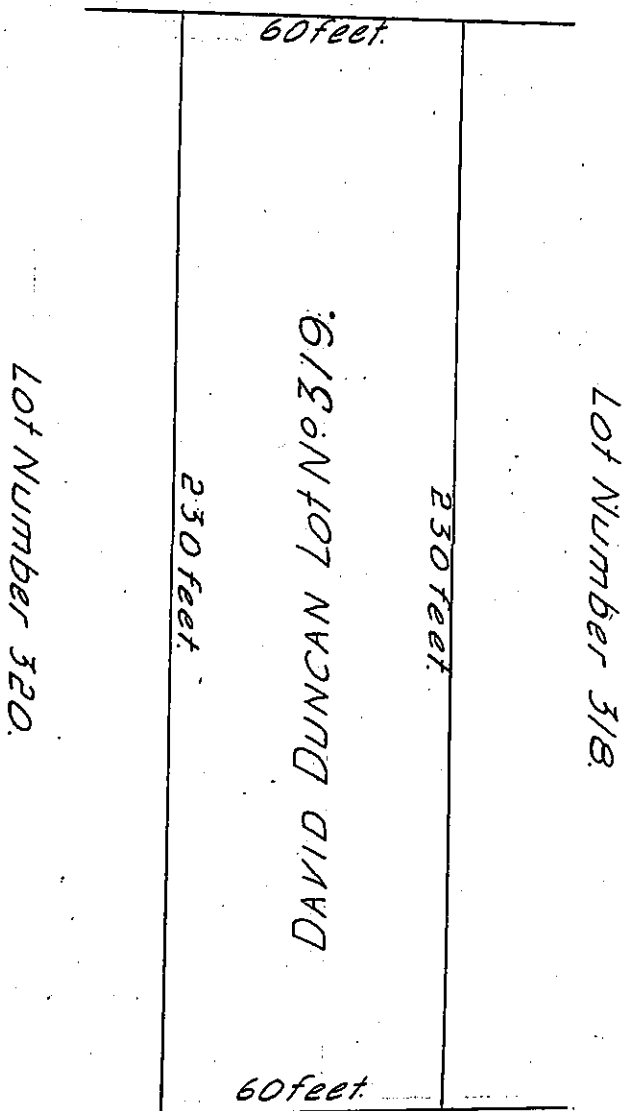


Hurtleberry

In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16th day of June 1772 a Survey was made on the 3^d day of July 1772 for David Duncan on a Certain Lot of Ground Situate in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland marked in a General Plan of said Town Number Three Hundred and Nineteen. Containing in Breadth East and West on the South side of Hurtleberry Street, Sixty feet, and in Length North and South Two Hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Northward by Hurtleberry Street, Eastward by Lot Number Three Hundred and Eighteen, Southward by Billberry Alley, and Westward by Lot Number Three Hundred & Twenty. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 23^d day of April 1776 for David Duncan.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eighteenth day of July 1904.
