Being a part of a larger tract of 346⁹³ 126 Ps & allowance, called "Ehrharts Valley" which was Originally Surveyed by Thomas Armor, assistant to George Stevenson late D.S. On the 24th of May 1759 in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 6th of August 1753, granted to William Ehrhart for 100⁹³ Resurveyed by William Matthews late D.S. on the 10th of the 12th mo 1773 in pursuance of a Warrant of Resurvey dated the 30th day of Sept^r 1773. And divided off from the Said larger tract on the 21st day of March 1794 by John Forsyth late D.S. And now after having been Carefully examined, Corrected & Calculated it is at the request of the present owner John Ehrhart returned for Confirmation the 23^d day of June Anno Domini 1810. Per.
