



Survey<sup>d</sup> to Charles Deal and Robert Weir on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 1802. the above described tract of three hundred and Twenty-nine Acres and one hundred and forty-seven perches & allowance of six per. Cent. &c. Situate in Brush Valley on each side the Path leading from Brakins Mill near McCandleses improv<sup>t</sup> and adjoining his other land in Wheatfield Township now Indiana County by Warrant of the 14<sup>th</sup> of March 1794.

N. B. The above Survey and Warrant was executed by Isaac Moor and returned by him to Thomas Alison D.S. but it never has been returned to the Surveyor Generals Office until now that I have Examined it and find it to be accurate.

That part of the above Tract as represented by the dotted line and the letters A & B. was Survey<sup>d</sup> by Thomas Alison to Patrick McCormick on the 17<sup>th</sup> October 1806 by Warr<sup>t</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> of October 1805
